Madame Alicia Birkett, A.R.C.M., L.R.A.M., was an inspirational and successful teacher of her many students from the southern area of this province. In 1927 she came to Canada from Yorkshire, England, where she had fondly been known as the "Nightingale of the North". She taught at the Regina Conservatory of Music, preparing her students for festival, examination, and concert appearances, until returning to England in the early fifties. Madame Birkett died in England in 1965.
